

OSHAB Transport Biosecurity

Truck and Trailer Wash Protocol

For all steps follow the pattern : OUTSIDE TO INSIDE, TOP TO BOTTOM, FRONT TO BACK



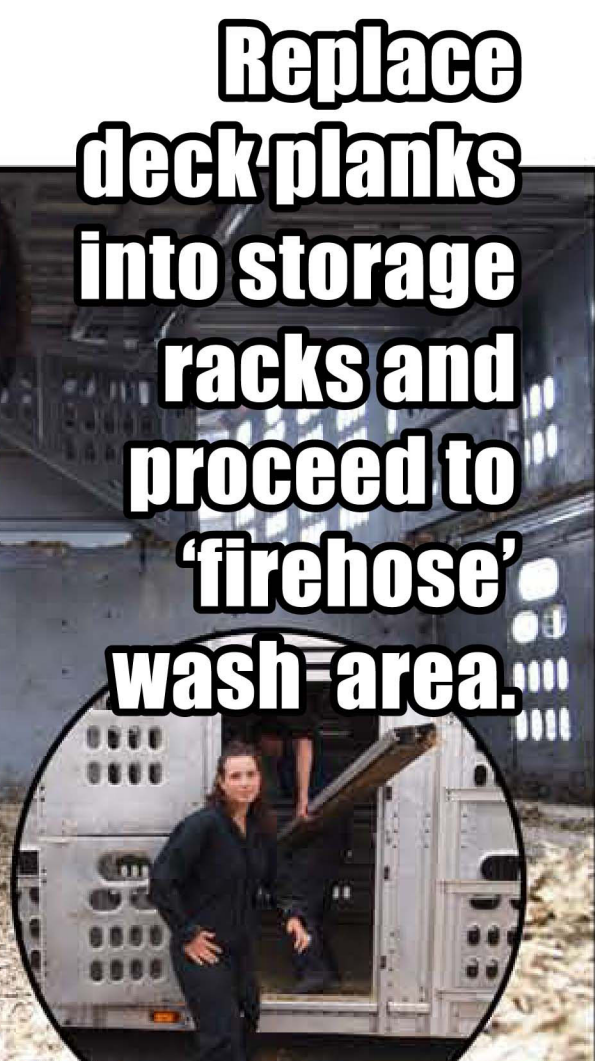
1 Scrape Out

Away from the wash bay, remove deck planks.



Knock off Bedding and Manure.

Scrape out trailer interior.



Replace deck planks into storage racks and proceed to 'firehose' wash-area.



2 Prep Trailer

Unload deck planks & winter panels into the wash bay

Remove and clean separately ALL on board equipment.



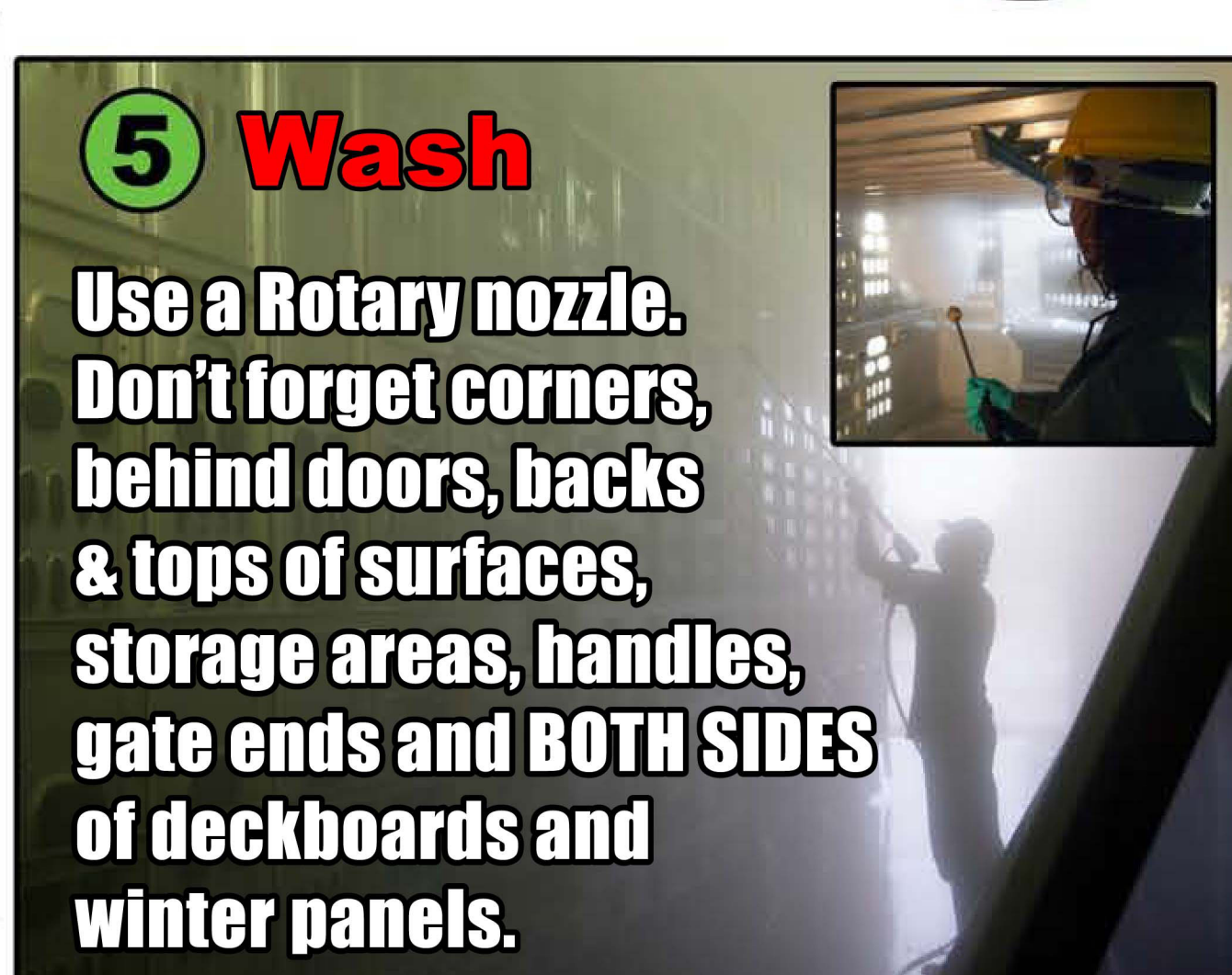
3 High Volume Wash

Rinse with lots of water to remove as much manure and bedding as possible.



4 Soap

Cover all surfaces including deck planks and winter boards using a foam gun. Let sit for 10 minutes.



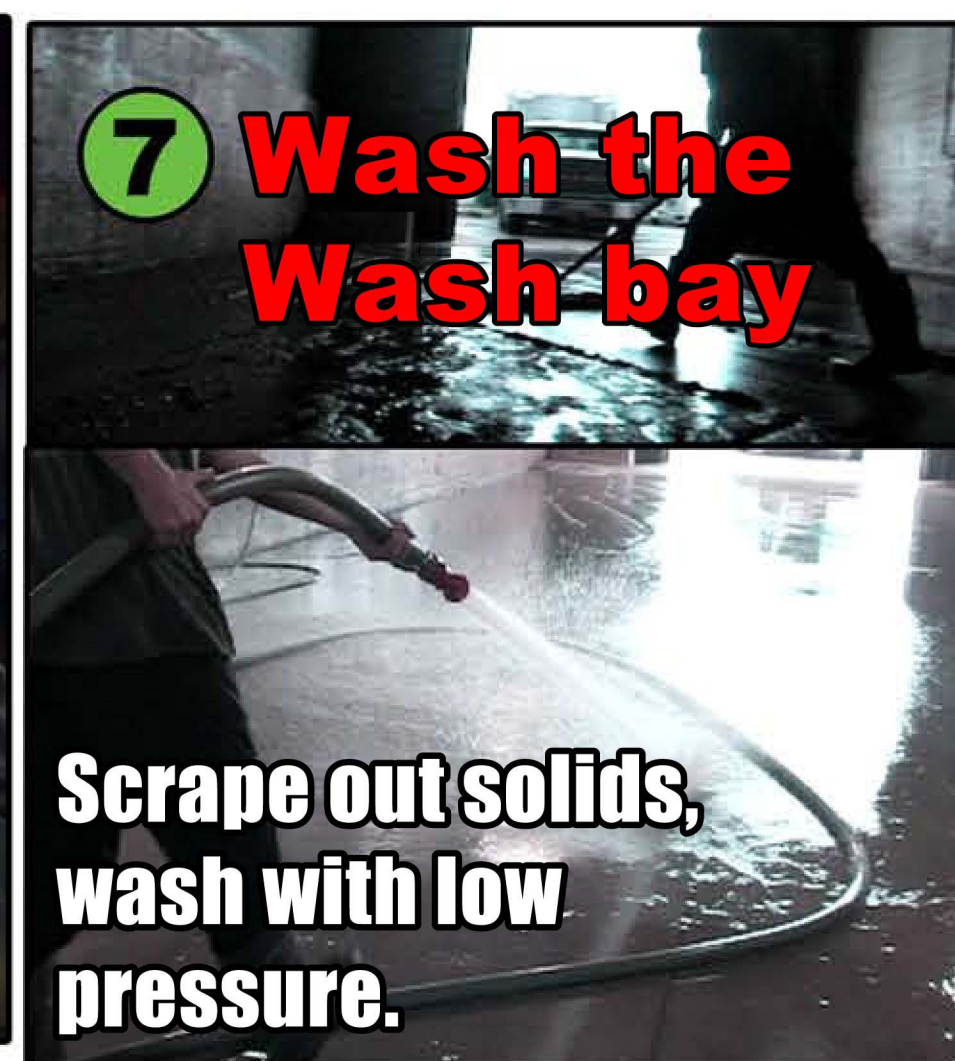
5 Wash

Use a Rotary nozzle. Don't forget corners, behind doors, backs & tops of surfaces, storage areas, handles, gate ends and BOTH SIDES of deckboards and winter panels.



6 Inspect

Wear clean boots and outerwear, use a flashlight, check your work, rewash any missed areas.



7 Wash the Wash bay

Scrape out solids, wash with low pressure.



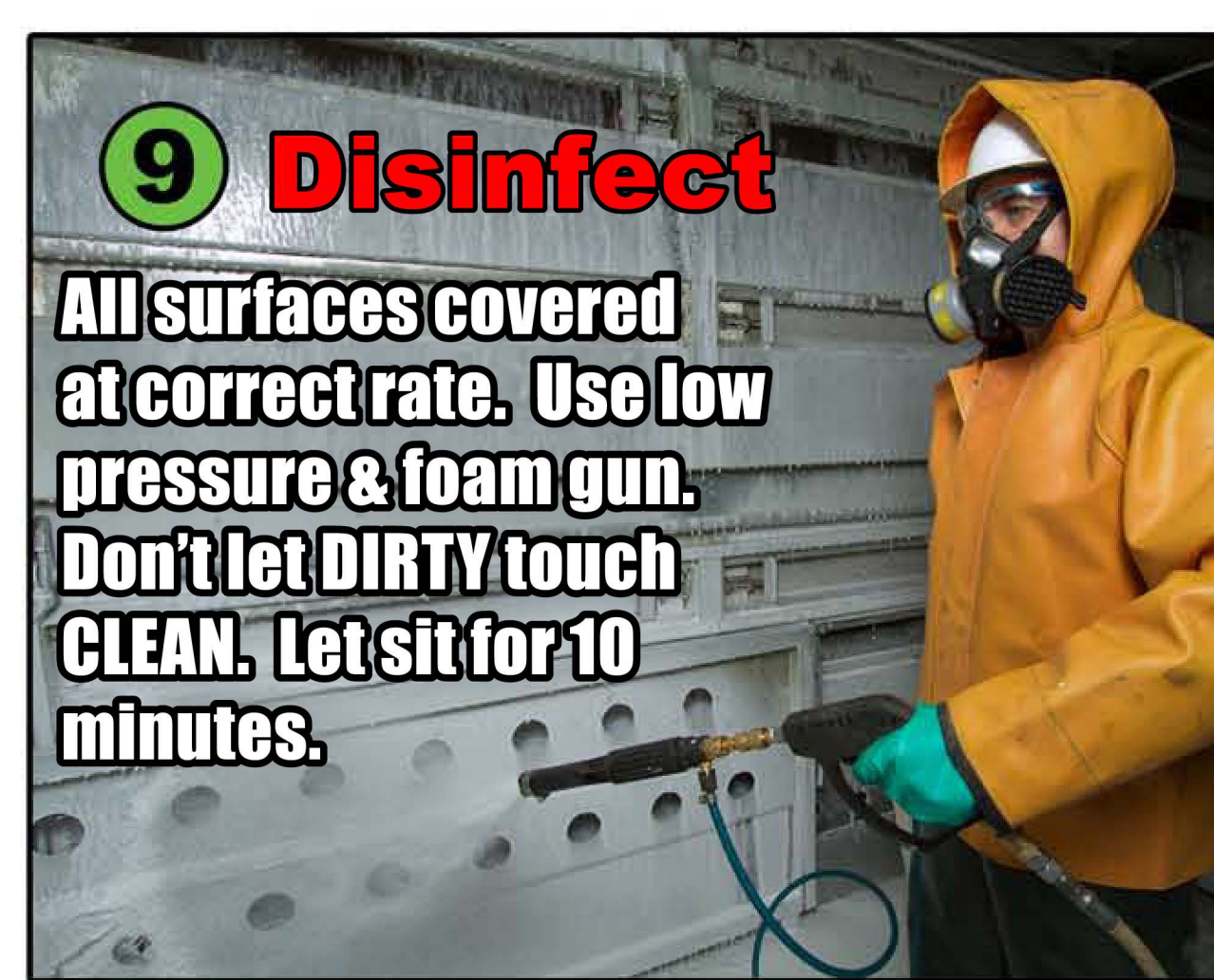
8 Reassemble

Wear clean boots and outerwear.

Replace deck planks and winter panels.

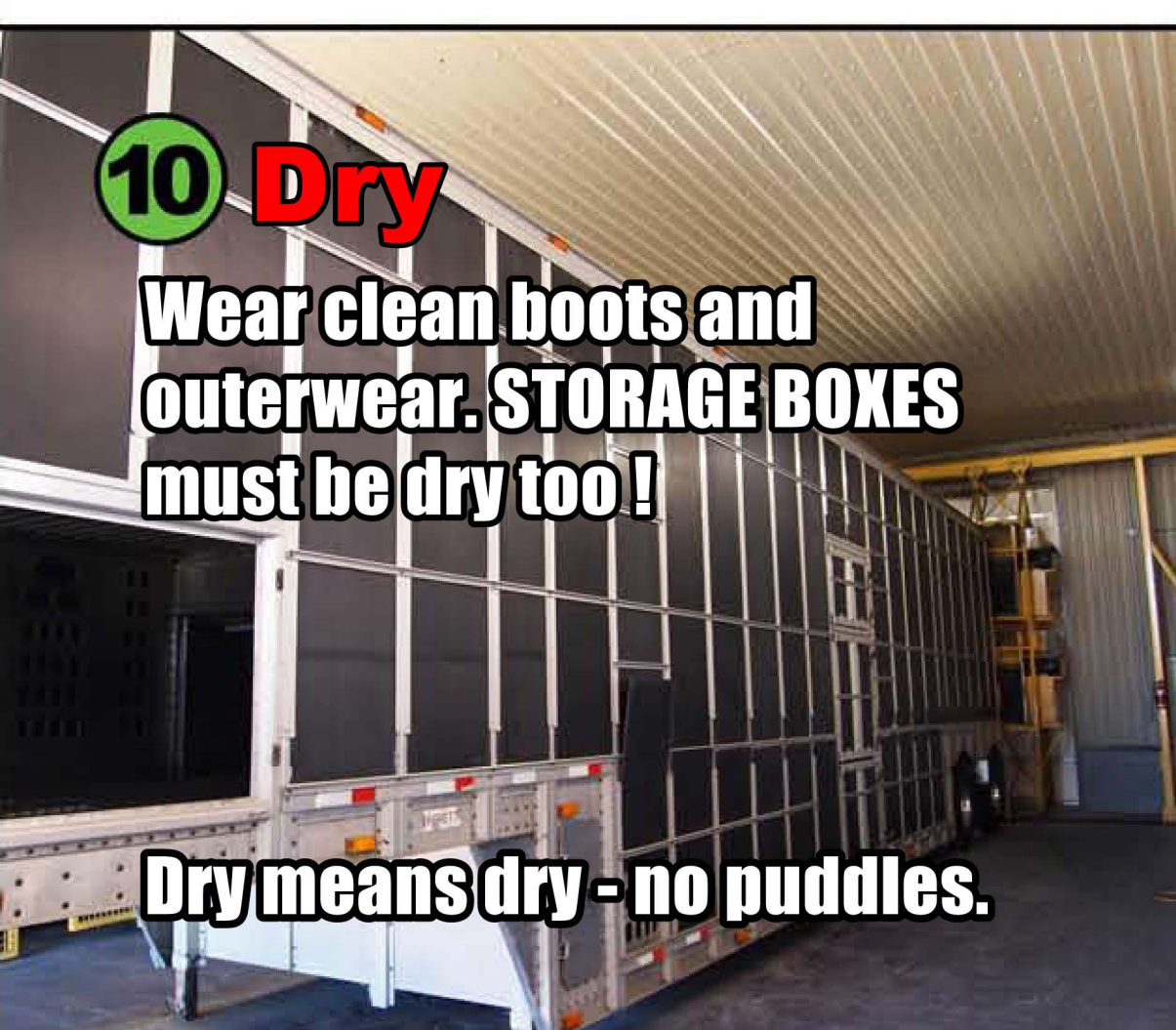


Wear appropriate protective gear - check the **MSDS** sheets for the products you are using.



9 Disinfect

All surfaces covered at correct rate. Use low pressure & foam gun. Don't let DIRTY touch CLEAN. Let sit for 10 minutes.



10 Dry

Wear clean boots and outerwear. STORAGE BOXES must be dry too!

Dry means dry - no puddles.



11 Cab

Clean and disinfect ANY surface the driver touches.



12 Keep it Clean

Park away from the wash bay, dirty trailers and livestock. Use clean, dry bedding. Don't let DIRTY touch CLEAN.
